Durham Volunteer Doulas, DVD, is the first organization in Durham that is offering free doula care to local women who normally can not afford this valuable service. Doulas help create birth plans, assist mothers during delivery and provide resources after labor. Research has shown many health benefits of doula care. Doulas decrease cesarean sections by 28% and provide 34% fewer negative birthing experiences.

The Durham Volunteer Doulas' goal is to provide doula assistance to the communities that need them most. In many cases, the maternal mortality rates are higher in non-white and non-rich communities. However, with doula fees ranging from \$250 to \$2,500, doulas are not accessible to those communities.
